Spot the Pronouns

Teacher's Notes

Procedure:

1. Objective: Students will recognize and identify pronouns in simple declarative and interrogative sentences.
2. Warm-up: Write a sentence with a name on the board (e.g., "Maria eats an apple"). Ask students to replace the name with a smaller word (e.g., "She eats an apple"). Explain that "She" is the pronoun.
3. Instruction: Read the sentences aloud to the class first. Ask students to circle the pronoun they hear. Refer them to the "Pronoun Bank" box if they get stuck.
4. Extension: Ask students to identify if the circled word is a Subject (the doer) or an Object (the receiver), though this may be advanced for early A1.
